	held at the Dorset History Centre due to their historical value and deteriorating	
	condition.	VW
	The 11 Indentures (wills and testaments) are on parchment-like paper affixed with	* **
	seals dating from the 1600's and 1700's. These indentures relate to the bequest of	
	substantial monies to be used for the purchase of land to support the poor within the	
	tythings that now make up the Parish of Buckland Newton (e.g. Duntish, Henley,	
	Knoll etc). This period predates the existence of Parish Councils which came into	
	existence in rural areas in 1894 and hence local worthies and respected elders were	
	charged with the execution of these Indentures and subsequent administration. The	
	most readable document of 1686 identifies these as Sir Nathaniel Napier of	
	Middlemarsh, William Frampton of Armswell, Rawleigh Sawname of Plush, and	
	Samuel Dunning, Walter Frampton, John Kaynes (Bookham), Walter Ffoy from the	
	parish of Buckland Newton. Parish Clerk to do letter to accompany documents.
