1.	Charles Gorton attended the meeting to raise the following points: 1. Mr Gorton asked why there was a need for the stones on the verge by the	
	playing field. The Parish Council advised that the stones were put there as the	
	verge had previously been churned up by passing vehicles.	
	2. He enquired why the SID (speed indictor display) pole had been removed and	
	was informed that there is a plan to reinstate the pole to a new location on the B3143, halfway down the playing field.	
	3. Mr Gorton asked whether the two toilets outside the Parish Room are for	
	general public use as several people had enquired in the shop. The toilets will	
	only be open during warmer months to prevent freezing pipes in the winter but	
	when available they are for the use of parishioners and persons using the	
	playing field.	
	4. Mr Gorton then asked whether the Parish Council would consider employing a lengthsman to carry out general maintenance around the parish. Cerne Abbas	
	Parish Council is in the process of carrying out a trial and it was suggested that	
	the Parish Clerk contacted them in a few months to find out if the trial had	
	been successful. East Coker Parish was also put forward as another point of	
	contact. The Parish Council are concerned with how much the extra cost	
	would affect the precept and also how the work would be managed.

	PCSO Vickie Hedges attended the meeting to give an update on local issues. There	
	has been an increase in rural theft in recent months particularly of agricultural equipment but also garage and shed break-ins. She emphasised the need for local	
	residents to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour.	
	The police will continue to carry out regular patrols of the area and have recently	
	carried out a night time operation which proved successful.	
	The Parish Council again raised concerns about the amount of speeding through the	
	village. Vickie suggested that the Parish Council and local residents send regular

Cllr Hammick to contact a local tradesman. 3. FBNS had asked whether it would be possible to hold the school Summer Fayre on the playing field in 2012 as it was intended to be a bigger event than usual tied in with the Queen's Jubilee. The Parish Council agreed this would be a good idea but requested to be told the planned date of the event as soon as possible. 4. Cllr Marpole to purchase a receptacle for cigarette butts to be situated by the bus shelter. 5. Cllr Baker to organise a quote for a new bus shelter.

Neighbourhood Plan At a meeting of the Neighbourhood Plan Working Party on the 15 th Sept 2011, one of the members had asked whether it might be possible for the Parish Clerk to take the minutes at future meetings. However, it was felt that as the Parish Clerk is not a member of the working party and also has other commitments, this would not be a practical option.	
2.	Cllr Baker informed the Parish Council that funding options were being investigated. Community Planning Grants are available but need to be match funded by other sources. The working party are looking at applying to various local organisations for the additional funding.	
4.	The group are looking into the setting up of a Parish Plan to run alongside the Neighbourhood Plan as it was felt that future questions could relate to both plans.
