	have been made to the draft neighbourhood plan. He will now meet with Jo Witherden.

Initial meetings will be in the village hall and then move to the Parish Room and will be held on different days and different times. All households and business in the village will be informed. Parish Councillors will man the sessions.	
3	A Strategic Environmental Screen Report has been done. This states whether we need to do a Strategic Environmental Screen Assessment. Oliver Rendell is dealing with this.	
4	A discussion took place on design specification for direction signage within the village. The signage will be the same standard and size and be controlled by the Parish Council. Fingerpost style was preferred in either wood or aluminium, white letters on black.
