2	Dorest Councillor (Chalk Valley) Cllr Iill Haynes Penort received	
	<u>Dorset Councillor (Chalk Valley) Cllr Jill Haynes</u> – Report received. The financial situation at the Council still remains very concerning. As I said in my last report, we	
	are predicting a £60M additional cost to the council due to Covid. We have received £21M from	
	central government but as yet nothing further. Senior management are meeting weekly with our	
	MP's asking for action but there has been no response so far. I am very concerned that the additional money will be sought by the government raising the council tax threshold which will be	
	a terrible blow to Dorset. On the more positive side we received £134M to support businesses and	
	have so far paid out £103M. All those who are eligible, but have not claimed, have been written to	
	urging them to get in touch. An addition £6M was provided by Government for those who fell	
	through the criteria for the main support grant. These were businesses like B&B's, charter boats, and some activity providers. This money was open for claim for a limited period and the fund is	
	now closed, 2100 businesses were further supported.	
	We have also received £340K to help support our high streets to re -open. This will be used creating pedestrian one-way systems, in some cases widening pavements and also some limited	
	road closures. There a dedicated team at the council involved in this work and some of the funding	
	will pay for advertising our small town centres.	
	The Institute of Fiscal Studies are predicting that Dorset will be in the bottom 9 worst affected	
	council areas for employment. This is due to so many jobs being tied to tourism and hospitality	
	businesses. In addition, they are mostly small seasonal businesses who cannot cope with losing a	
	summers income. The council is already working with Bournemouth University to see what training and skill opportunities could be provided going forward. It is really important that we	
	encourage diversification opportunities and that they are for better paid work.	
	Over 1100 laptops have been provided by the council, businesses and charitable organisations to assist young people from poorer families to access schooling during the lockdown. In many cases	
	we also had to assist in getting them a broad band connection too. The council will be sponsoring	
	a series of activities through a "Summer in Dorset" programme. These will be targeted at special	
	needs children, young carers and others whose families may need respite. There will be lots	
	happening including at some of the council's outdoor education centres and I have asked for full details when they are ready.	
	In some areas there has been a spike in antisocial behaviour involving young people. We have	
	found that this is often linked to "County line" activity. Probably not so much in our very rural	

	villages but certainly in the bigger villages and towns. We all need to be vigilant as our area is an easy target. Please watch out for additional/unusual vehicle movements, particularly taxis from out of the area, many are coming here from Liverpool and Manchester. Young people that are not about and then back mixing with friends possibly using more money than they would usually. The police are being very proactive in this and so please do not hesitate to contact them if you have concerns. There will be a special Joint Health Scrutiny of both Dorset and BCP committees on 1st July to look at the health response to Covid 19. We have, so far been relatively lightly affected by the virus but there will be lessons to be learnt and I know the committees will want to understand how prepared we are if there is a second wave of infection. More on this in my July report. I should now say something about the issues there have been in recent days at our beaches. I'm sure you are just as disgusted as I am about the behaviour exhibited. It takes up a considerable	
	amount of officer time and cost to patrol, police and then clear up after these events, to say nothing of the blatant disregard for social distancing. Yesterday there was 27 tons of waste on Bournemouth beach alone. The council is doing its best to say keep safe, but I suppose part of the problem is that we are just within range of a day's drive from London and the midlands.

1	WD/D/20/001058 KNAP FARM, LOCKETTS LANE, BUCKLAND NEWTON, DORCHESTER, DT2 7BS Form new agricultural access track. Comments by 7 June 2020 - Buckland Newton Parish Council object to this planning application.	

This application has caused a great deal of concern amongst our Parishioners and a number of very relevant highway and environmental points are raised in their many letters sent to you.

Hilling Lane is totally unsuitable for any increase in large sized traffic such as that of modern farm vehicles or HGV's and offers no benefit whatsoever to the existing farm access via Locketts Lane. It is also a single track road but with additional highway dangers. To the north of the proposed access, the lane is heavily confined by high hedges along with a very blind bend on the steepest section, and to the south by a dangerous junction and blind cross roads at Henley.

Since Knap Farm is in the same ownership and contiguous to Court Farm Business Park, with its own excellent vehicular access for HGV's north towards the main Sherborne - Dorchester road, the creation of an additional farm access onto narrow Hilling Lane with all its inbuilt dangers, seems unnecessary purely for agricultural activity.

Hilling Lane is much used locally by pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders and over a considerable part of its length there is little room for foot and cycle traffic to pass even a small vehicle, such as a car.

The proposed track itself is within the AONB and raises a number of environmental concerns, as documented in objectors' letters.

We would request a site visit from both the Planning Officer, Environmental Officer and Highways Officer before a decision is reached on this application.
