

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FACTORY LANE, BUCKLAND NEWTON

DORSET COUNCIL has made an Order under Section 14 [1] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984, as amended. The Order is needed in order to comply with health and safety regulations, which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise the likelihood of danger to highway users. It will come into operation between 09:00 and 16:00 on 1st February 2024 and will remain in force for 18 months and can be extended with the approval of the Secretary of State for Transport if necessary; however, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 9th February 2024.

This Order will enable Dorset Council to carry out carriageway maintenance and resurfacing works.

The effect of this Order is as follows:


[1] To impose temporary road closure on Factory Lane Buckland Newton, between Revels Hill and B3143 (in both directions), a distance of approximately 2230 metres. A locally signed diversion route will be put in place to enable traffic to travel around the closed section.

[2] To impose clearway and parking suspension as indicated by signs on site to prevent waiting or parking on the highway along Factory Lane Buckland Newton, between Revels Hill and B3143 (in both directions), a distance of approximately 2230 metres. Any vehicle waiting in contravention of any restriction imposed by this Notice may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986.
